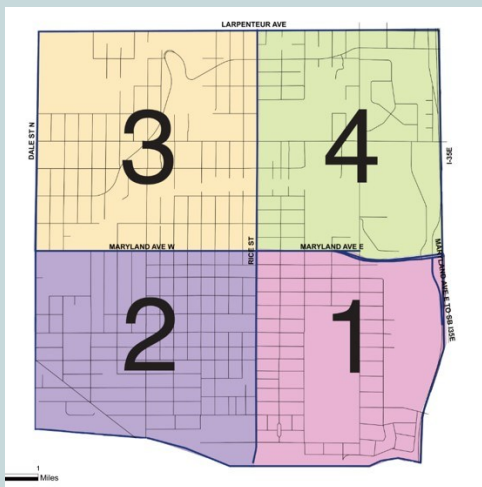

Special Election: February 5th

The North End Neighborhood Organization will hold a special election on Monday February 5th to fill vacant board seats.

The boundaries of the North End are:

Interstate 35 to the east

Dale Street to the west

Burlington RR tracks to the south

Larpenteur Avenue to the north

To vote or run for an open seat you must be 16 years of age and live in the North End. To vote for quadrant seats you must live in the quadrant. For At-Large seat you may live anywhere within the North End boundaries. The following quadrants have open seats and are up for election:

Quadrant 1: one seat: Maryland Avenue, Rice Street, Burlington Northern RR tracks, 35E

Quadrant 4: two seats: Larpenteur Avenue, 35E, Maryland Avenue, Rice Street

At Large: one seat

Student: two At Large seats: students must be 16 years old, attend a school or live within the boundaries of the North End and cannot have a parent or guardian as a Board Member

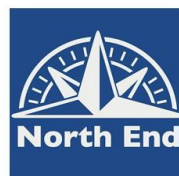

“Thought before any community planning could begin the physical and social issues must be examined

Rice Street was congested with vehicle traffic and was hazardous for pedestrians

Neighborhoods were physically separated by barriers

Greenway: no vehicle traffic, bikes and pedestrian traffic only

Wheelock as a bike route “
